

Stage Three Water Restrictions June 1

Wylie will enact Stage 3 Water Restrictions beginning June 1 at the request of the North Texas Municipal Water District due to below average rainfall and low lake levels.

Watering lawns is limited to once per week according to your trash day. New construction landscape may be watered as necessary for 30 days from the date of the certificate of occupancy. Outdoor watering during precipitation is prohibited.

Watering lawns is prohibited between 10 am - 6 pm from April 1 through October 31 of each year.

Foundations, new landscaping, and new plantings may be watered for up to 2 hours a day by a hand-held hose, soaker hose or dedicated zone using drip irrigation.

No hosing of paved areas, buildings or windows. Pressure washing is allowed.

Existing pools may not be drained and refilled, except to replace evaporation. New pools may be filled.

Operation of ornamental fountains or other amenities using treated water is allowed with an approved variance.

When washing cars, a hose with a shut-off nozzle must be used to reduce water waste.

Hydroseeding, hydromulching and sprigging is allowed with an approved variance.

Rain and freeze sensors and/or ET (evapotranspiration) or smart controllers are required on all new irrigation systems and must be maintained and function properly.

Golf courses may water greens and tee boxes without restriction and public athletic fields may be watered twice per week.
