Wylie Mayor Proclaims National Magic Week

Governor, Congress, State House join mayor in recognizing magic as art

Wylie, TX, Oct. 30, 2014 –At the Oct. 28 meeting of Wylie City Council, Mayor Eric Hogue read a proclamation declaring Oct. 25 - 31 as National Magic Week in Wylie, recognizing magic as an art. With the proclamation, Wylie joins the Texas Legislature, the U.S. House of Representatives and Governor Rick Perry in similar recognitions.

The proclamations represent the culmination of Hogue's efforts over the last year to achieve art status for magic. "Magic is a type of performance that has entertained audiences for many years, but it is much more," Hogue said. "Magic can be used therapeutically to increase manual dexterity and hand-eye coordination in young people and senior citizens. I have worked closely with Dal Sanders, former national president of Society of American Magicians, to acquire the art designation, which opens the door for magicians to apply for corporate grants to fund visits to children's hospitals, nursing homes and schools."

Sanders was present at the council meeting, along with Mike Squires, former president of Dallas Magic Clubs, and Frank Seltzer, current president of DMC, all of whom performed magic for those gathered. City Manager Mindy Manson was pressed into service; among other magician assistant duties, she held the other side of a table that Sanders had caused to levitate.

In addition to reading the city's proclamation, Hogue reminded those gathered that Congressman Pete Sessions had addressed the U.S. Congress in April, proclaiming magic to be an art, thereby entering that fact into the Congressional Record. Saying, "But we're not done yet!" Hogue also presented the visiting magicians with a Texas flag that had flown over the state capitol, sent in honor of National Magic Week by Representative Jodie Laubenberg. Finally, Hogue read a proclamation from Governor Perry, recognizing the last week in October as National Magic Week and recognizing magic to be a true art.
