### **Wylie City Council to Consider Resolution on Proposed Toll Road**

**WHAT:** Wylie City Council will hold a special called meeting Monday, Oct. 6, at 5:30 pm, to consider a resolution opposing the construction of the private toll road, known as the Northeast Gateway Project, in the City of Wylie and its extraterritorial jurisdiction.

Recognizing the growth of Collin County and surrounding areas, the resolution acknowledges the need for and supports long-range, comprehensive and regional transportation. It also acknowledges the input the council has received along with the multiple discussions and work sessions in which the members have participated.

The private-sector company proposing to build the 28-mile road is the Texas Turnpike Corporation. The TTC is utilizing a state statute, which has since been repealed, that gave authority to a private entity to construct a toll road, including the power of eminent domain. The TTC is currently going through the environmental assessment process that is being monitored by the Texas Department of Transportation.
