

#### Anna man sentenced for abusing 9-year-old

An Anna man was sentenced to 35 years in prison without the possibility of parole after being convicted of sexually abusing a 9-year-old girl, according to the Collin County district attorney's office.

Cody Allan Srader, 44, was convicted Wednesday after a trial before District Judge Keith Dean. The judge found Srader guilty of continuous sexual abuse of a child and indecency with a child by contact.

Evidence showed Srader began sexually abusing a girl he knew when she was 9 years old. He threatened to harm her if she ever told anyone about the abuse, according to prosecutors. In the most recent incident, Srader gave the girl a drink that made her dizzy and then molested her. The girl's relatives got suspicious when they couldn't find her and Srader lied about where she was. Prosecutors say the girl escaped and told a relative about the abuse.

The case was investigated by the

Collin County sheriff's office Child Abuse Task Force. The judge assessed punishment after considering evidence as well as Srader's extensive criminal record, which included assault, robbery, aggravated assault of a public servant, assault family violence, terroristic threat, evading arrest, criminal mischief, criminal trespass and reckless driving.

#### Driver dies after medical problems lead to crash

A driver died early Thursday after crashing into a concrete wall along the Dallas North Tollway.

The crash was reported about 3:45 a.m. on the tollway at Parker Road, police said. The driver, who was carrying no ID, was in bad shape when paramedics and firefighters arrived.

He was taken to a hospital in critical condition and died shortly afterward.

Police said the crash did not cause much damage to the vehicle, and they suspect the driver was suffering from a medical condition when he lost control.

The crash remains under investigation.

Police questioned a suspect but made no arrest after a 73-year-old man was shot Wednesday during a road-rage confrontation.

The shooting was reported by the victim, who was wounded about 4:30 p.m. in the 1300 block of Saddleback Lane, in a neighborhood off West Corporate Drive.

The 51-year-old gunman also called 911, saying he had shot the victim because he felt threatened, according to police. He was taken in for questioning.

The victim was taken to Medical Center of Lewisville with a bullet in his leg and a graze wound on his upper torso.

No charges have been filed. "Detectives are still investigating to determine what may have led to the shooting," Capt. Kevin Deaver said in a written statement.

## New police, fire training center opens

A new training facility for Fort Worth police and firefighters officially opened Thursday during a ribbon-cutting ceremony.

The Bob Bolen Public Safety Complex at 505 W. Felix St. will serve the Fort Worth Police Department and Fort Worth Fire Department.

Officials called the center the "culmination of a multi-year effort to build a world-class facility." The complex includes a village of buildings meant to simulate what officers and firefighters will experience in the streets of Fort Worth.

The new complex replaces a facility in the 1000 block of Calvert Street.

The compound is named for the city's longest-serving mayor, Bob Bolen, who died last year.



#### Shooting follows fight in streets; no arrests made

Police are investigating a street fight and drive-by shooting that happened late Wednesday.

An officer was called to the 700 block of Williams Street around 8:30 p.m. and found several men fighting in the street. The men scattered when police arrived.

A few minutes later, shots were fired, apparently from a vehicle nearby along U.S. Highway 77. No injuries were reported.

Police converged on the area, with help from officers from Milford, Waxahachie, Cedar Hill and DeSoto, along with sheriff's deputies and a Department of Public Safety helicopter.

No arrests were made, however, and the men involved in the fight are still at large, police said.
