City email addresses on adultery site's lists cleared

Plano officials have found no evidence that two employees used their city email accounts to access the adultery website AshleyMadison.com. The city has closed its investigation.

Last week, Plano was one of half a

dozen local cities that began investigations after city email addresses appeared to have been found on the lists of Ashley Madison's customers released by hackers.

Fort Worth and Garland quickly determined that the email accounts that appeared to be linked to the cities were actually bogus email addresses.

Plano officials did not elaborate on how they determined that no city policies were breached.

Budget hearing, recreation fees on council's agenda

The City Council will host a public

hearing at its Tuesday meeting on the proposed 2015-16 budget and discuss recreation fees.

City officials are proposing a one-percent reduction in the property tax rate to \$.87 per \$100. The proposed budget includes an increase in personnel across several departments and an average salary increase of 3 percent.

Although the budget will raise 4.09 percent more in total property taxes, the city says \$823,890 of that is due to new properties added to the tax roll.

A second public hearing on the budget will take place Sept. 1, with the council expected to vote on the matter Sept. 8.

The board will meet at 6 p.m. at City Hall, 300 Country Club Road.

UTA exhibit features Von Erich family

When Oliver Bateman sorted through a photo collection of professional wrestlers in action during the early 1980s at Will Rogers Memorial Coliseum, he couldn't notice the crowd's reaction in the background.

In photographer Cirrus Bonneau's black-and-white images, you see adoring fans captivated by the Von Erichs — Fritz, Kevin, David, Kerry, Mike and Chris — while others show people also shaking their fists at the wrestling villains of the day.

To Bateman, a University of Texas at Arlington assistant professor of history with a passion for pro wrestling, that was what set Bonneau's photos apart.

Bateman's interest and Bonneau's photos evolved into a new exhibit that debuted Monday at UTA Libraries Special Collections. Titled "Ringside: Memories of World Class Championship Wrestling," the 30-plus photos will be on display through Jan. 16 at the UTA Central Library, 702 Planetarium Place.

In 2013, former UTA librarian Melissa Gonzales ran across the negatives, which Bonneau donated, during routine sorting. When Bateman finally got around to checking out the images, he was fascinated by Bonneau's work.

"He had a friend who lived very close to the Will Rogers center, and they'd walk down there and watch the wrestling," Bateman said. Rather than tight shots of wrestlers' faces, "he had a wide-angle lens, and you see how everything was exposed to the back to see the fans in that arena."

Construction to widen Bursey Road is expected to limit traffic to one way between Whitley Road and Willis Lane for most of the 2015-16 school



County to work on redrawing precinct lines

Denton County's growth has affected its voter precincts.

A small number of precincts have swelled over their limits. County

Elections Administrator Lannie Noble, Denton County Republican Party Chairwoman Dianne Edmondson and Denton County Democratic Party Chairwoman Phyllis Wolper plan to meet Sept. 8 to work on redrawing precinct lines.

That threshold, according to election law, is 5,000 voters. Denton County has 145 precincts, and the process should add five to 10 more, Edmondson said. Among the suggested precincts, Edmondson said she thinks the Robson Ranch development in far southwest Denton should be its own precinct.

Ex-teacher charged with improper relationship

A former Lake Dallas ISD teacher and softball coach was arrested Monday and charged with improper relationship between an educator and student, Corinth police say.

Dugan P. Walker, 59, was booked into the Denton County Jail on Monday, but has since posted \$5,000 bond, according to records.

Walker did not immediately return a request for comment.

The district notified Corinth police after concerns were raised Aug. 6 about potentially inappropriate communication or conduct be-

tween Walker and a student at Lake Dallas High School, superintendent Gayle Stinson said in a prepared statement.

Walker was placed on administrative leave, pending the outcome of the investigation, but has since resigned, Stinson said.

Walker was the head coach at Lewisville before taking over at Lake Dallas in 2010. He stepped down from his coaching role earlier this year.
