

#### Council to discuss updating water rules

The City Council will consider updating its water conservation measures on Tuesday to coincide with the plan by the North Texas Municipal Water District to lift Stage 3 water restrictions on May 1.

The city's proposal will continue to emphasize wise water use as it transitions from water restrictions to best management practices for outdoor watering.

The main watering day will remain on the resident's trash day. A second watering day will be permitted when recommended by the city's weather station data. The push will be to concentrate on efficient use of water regardless of what the lake levels are.

The council will also hold public hearings for a request to amend the planned development at the northwest corner of Main Street and the Dallas North Tollway as well as for specific use permits for a child care facility on Stonebrook Parkway, an automotive rental facility on Teel Parkway and a renewal for the Espiritu bar in Frisco Square.

The meeting starts at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall, 6101 Frisco Square Blvd.

#### 'Fill the Boot' effort falls short of last year

The totals are in for the three-day "Fill the Boot" campaign, and the community fell short on donations compared with 2014, Denton fire officials said.

From Thursday through Saturday last week, Denton firefighters accepted donations for the Muscular Dystrophy Association, which sponsors neuromuscular disease research.

"We collected a total of \$44,919 over the three days last week," Battalion Chief Brian Glenn said via email. In 2014, the department collected \$54,150 in its "Fill the Boot" campaign.

#### Report involving educator, student being investigated

Denton police and school district officials are investigating allegations of an improper relationship between an educator and a student, officials confirmed Friday.

Officer Ryan Grelle, spokesman for Denton police, said the department was made aware of an alleged improper relationship on Thursday after a school resource officer spoke to

a district employee.

Grelle said the department and the school district will work together to investigate the allegations.

Mario Zavala, spokesman for Denton ISD, released the following statement:

"Denton ISD reported allegations that an inappropriate relationship may have occurred between a former staff member and a student to the Denton Police Department on April 16, 2015.

"Any time allegations of this nature are brought to light, our administrators contact local law enforcement immediately to launch an investigation. At the same time, school personnel work with other staff members to gather information and support law enforcement."

#### Home invasion robbery, shooting leave 2 injured

At least two people were wounded Sunday in a home invasion robbery and shooting.

About 10 p.m., six armed men broke into a unit at the Woodland Apartments in the 1200 block of Castle Gardens Drive. The robbers shot one man in the leg and beat another. A woman hid with her child while the masked men demanded their property.

The woman, who asked that her name not be used, said her brother was shot in the leg trying to fight the men off. Her boyfriend was also wounded as the intruders tried to tie them up.

Police say the two victims were treated and released from a hospital Monday morning. They are investigating whether another gunshot victim who showed up at the hospital is connected to the robbery.

The case remains under investigation; no arrests had been made.

#### Parolee flees police, is accused of carjacking

Police are searching for a man who fled from officers and is accused of carjacking a minivan Monday.

Fidel Martinez, who has previously been convicted of auto theft and evading and resisting arrest, is wanted on a

parole violation, Fort Worth police said.

On Monday, officers attempted to pull over Martinez, 36, but he and a passenger fled in a vehicle about 4 p.m. in the 3300 block of Northeast 28th Street.

The chase ended about 4:30 p.m. at Dillon Circle in Haltom City. Martinez and the passenger ran off, but the passenger was detained and released without charges, said Fort Worth Sgt. Steve Enright. Police said Martinez then carjacked a silver 2007 Honda Odyssey minivan with Texas license plate CPG-5371.

He did not display a weapon when he took the vehicle, and the occupants got out of the van unharmed, said Haltom City Detective Ray Beshirs.

Fort Worth police warn that Martinez is dangerous. Anyone who sees him is asked to call 911 immediately.

#### Postal employee arrested for pulling gun on co-workers

A U.S. Postal Service employee is facing an aggravated assault charge for pulling a gun on co-workers at a Fort Worth post office Monday morning, police say.

Police said Jason Silmon entered the post office at 400 N. Retta Road at about 7:30 a.m., pulled out a handgun and ordered 11 co-workers to get on the ground.

The employees complied and after a few minutes, Silmon put the gun

down and waited for officers to arrive, police said. Silmon was arrested. No injuries were reported.

Silmon's father, Robert Silmon, told the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* that his 27-year-old son was not violent and had worked for the post office for more than a decade. He did say that his son told him Friday he left work early to cool off after a confrontation with co-workers.

#### Police identify suspect in strangling of wife

Police have identified a Haltom City man accused of strangling his estranged wife last week.

Randy Cummings, 42, faces a charge of capital murder in the death of his wife, Laura Cummings. Hurst police said the couple was in the process of getting a divorce.

Laura Cummings, 43, was found dead Friday morning in her Hurst apartment after missing an appointment at a domestic violence resource center. She was strangled, according to the Tarrant County medical examiner's office.

Her husband was arrested Friday evening at his home in Haltom City. He is also charged with assault causing bodily injury and family violence in Tarrant County from a previous offense, police said. Cummings is being held in the Hurst jail, with bail set at \$1 million for the capital murder charge.
