J F ALL *Spirit Week Showdown*, Crystal Allen

- Nine-year-old Mya is excited about participating in School Spirit Week, even making a pinky promise with her best friend Naomi to be her partner, but when she accidentally gets paired with the biggest bully in school, Mean Connie, Naomi is mad at Maya for breaking her promise, so she must learn to work with Mean Connie and try and get her friend back.

J F BAR *The Mostly True Story of Jack*, Kelly Regan Barnhill

- Jack is practically invisible at home, but when his parents send him to Hazelwood, Iowa, to spend a summer with his odd aunt and uncle, he suddenly makes friends, is beaten up by the town bully, and is plotted against by the richest man in town.

J F BAS *Runt*, Nora Raleigh Baskin

- From different perspectives, explores middle school bullying as Maggie, tired of Elizabeth Moon's superior attitude, creates a fake profile on a popular social networking site to teach Elizabeth a lesson.

J F BIT *Miss Wolf and the Porkers*, Bill Condon

- When the new librarian arrives at Mount Barker, the Porkers try to bug and humiliate her with every trick in the book.

J F BLU *Blubber*, Judy Blume

- Jill goes along with the rest of the fifth-grade class in tormenting a classmate and then finds out what it is like when she, too, becomes a target.

J F BOE *The P.S. Brothers*, Maribeth Boelts

- Sixth-graders Russell and Shawn, poor and picked on, work together scooping dog droppings to earn money for a Rottweiler puppy to protect them from bullies, but when they learn the puppies' owner is running an illegal dog-fighting ring, they are torn about how to respond.

J F COD *Vive la Paris*, Esme Raji Codell

- Fifth-grader Paris learns some lessons about dealing with bullies of all kinds as she wonders how to stop a classmate from beating up her brother at school and as she learns about the Holocaust from her piano teacher, Mrs. Rosen.

J F COL *Medusa Jones*, Ross Collins

- In ancient Greece, Medusa Jones, a gorgon, and her friends, a minotaur and a centaur, are mocked and sneered at by the other Acropolis Academy children whose parents are kings and gods, but when they go on a school camping trip together, the "freaks" become true heroes.

J F CRI *My Dog, Cat*, Marty Crisp

- Ten-year-old Abbie, bullied at school for being small, wants to get a big black dog, but two months of living with a little Yorkshire terrier changes his mind about a number of things.

J F DON *Thank you, Lucky Stars*, Beverly Donofrio

- Ally has looked forward to a new school year, especially since she and her best friend, Betsy, have planned since kindergarten to sing in the fifth grade talent show, but Betsy has a new best friend and Ally, shy and prone to cry, is targeted by bullies and a strange new student who is looking for a friend.

J F DOW *The Second Life of Abigail Walker*, Frances O’Roark Dowell

- Bullied by two mean girls in her sixth-grade class, a lonely, plump girl gains self-confidence and makes new friends after a mysterious fox gently bites her.

J F ENG *Dog Days*, Karen English

- Gavin wants to make a good impression at Carver Elementary, where no one knows he excels at soccer and skateboarding, but an annoying big sister, a bully, and his great aunt's Pomeranian are not helping.

J F FAI *Sophie Loves Jimmy*, Nancy N. Rue

- Paired with her classmate Jimmy for school and church projects, twelve-year-old Sophie must find a way to dispel the boyfriend rumors and to stop the cyberbullying campaign directed against her and a former school bad boy.

J F FAR *Rules to Rock By*, Josh Farrar

- Annabella Cabrera tries to start a rock band at her new middle school in Providence, Rhode Island, but has trouble when the members of a rival band bully her and she develops a case of writer's block.

J F FLE *The Saturday Boy*, David Fleming

- Every school day seems to bring more trouble to eleven-year-old Derek, whose former best friend bullies him, while at home he deals with the long absence of his father, a Blackhawk helicopter pilot, and his mother's sudden moodiness.

J F FOU *The Fourth Stall*, Chris Rylander

- Sixth-graders Mac and Vince operate a business charging schoolmates for protection from bullies and for help to negotiate conflicts peacefully, with amazing challenges and results.

J F GER *I am Jack*, Susanne Gervay

- Eleven-year-old Jack suffers terrible headaches as he worries that his grandmother will soon die, his mother's boyfriend will move in--or leave--and especially that the school bully will get revenge for Jack's ill-timed joke at his expense.

J F GIN *George*, Alex Gino

- When people look at George, they think they see a boy. But she knows she's not a boy. She knows she's a girl. George thinks she'll have to keep this a secret forever. Then her teacher announces that their class play is going to be Charlotte's Web. George really, really, REALLY wants to play Charlotte. But the teacher says she can't even try out for the part...because she's a boy. With the help of her best friend, Kelly, George comes up with a plan. Not just so she can be Charlotte -- but so everyone can know who she is, once and for all

J F GLA *Call Me Oklahomal*, Miriam Glassman

- Paige Turner starts fourth grade with a new name in hopes of being more bold and brave, especially when dealing with class bully Viveca and overcoming her stagefright.

J F GOL *Twerp*, Mark Goldblatt

- In Queens, New York, in 1969, twelve-year-old Julian Twerski writes a journal for his English teacher in which he explores his friendships and how they're effected by girls, a new student who may be as fast as Julian, and especially an incident of bullying.

J F HAH *Where I Belong*, Mary Downing Hahn

- Eleven-year-old Brendan Doyle doesn't get along with his foster mother, he's failing fifth grade, and he's bullied mercilessly by a band of boys in his class. Then Brendan meets two potential friends--an eccentric old man and a girl from summer school--and he sees that there may be hope for him after all

J F HOL *Rhyme Schemer*, K.A. Holt

- A novel in verse about Kevin's journey from bully to being bullied, as he learns about friendship, family, and his talent for poetry.

J F JET *Hit & Miss*, Derek Jeter

- Young Derek Jeter's friendship with a new student puts him at odds with his friends and seems to be hurting his baseball swing, plus he gets in trouble for confronting a student who is bullying his sister, in violation of the contract with his parents.

J F IFU *I Funny: A Middle School Story*, James Patterson

- Jamie Grimm's a middle schooler on a mission: he wants to become the world's greatest standup comedian, even if he doesn't have a lot to laugh about these days. He's new in town and stuck living with his aunt, uncle, and their evil son Stevie, a bully who doesn't let Jamie's wheelchair stop him from giving Jamie a good pounding every once in awhile.

J F IFU *I Even Funnier: A Middle School Story*, James Patterson

- While on a mission to win the Planet's Funniest Kid Comic regional competition, New York middle schooler Jamie Grimm copes with rival comics and bullies, a buddy in trouble, and a sudden family emergency, all with a sense of humor and a loyal group of friends

J F LAF *Eight Keys*, Suzanne M. LaFleur

- When twelve-year-old Elise, orphaned since age three, becomes disheartened by middle school, with its bullies, changing relationships, and higher expectations, keys to long-locked rooms and messages from her late father help her cope.

J F LAG *My Heart is Laughing*, Rose Lagercrantz

- Dani's been trying her best to stay happy ever since her best friend Ella moved away. But when some girls in Dani's class start being cruel to her, it starts a chain of rather unhappy events. It would all be okay if only Ella would move back.

J F MCK *Binny in Secret*, Hilary McKay (*Binny for Short* is the prequel)

- While getting bullied at school, twelve-year-old Binny investigates the disappearance of her brother's chicken and tries to save an endangered lynx.

J F PAL *Auggie & Me: Three Wonder Stories*, R.J. Palacio

- These stories are an extra peek at Auggie, a boy born with extreme facial abnormalities, before he started at Beecher Prep and during his first year there. Readers get to see him through the eyes of Julian, the bully; Christopher, Auggie's oldest friend; and Charlotte, Auggie's new friend at school.

J F PAT *The Field of the Dogs*, Katherine Paterson

- Josh, who has just moved to Vermont with his mother, stepfather, and new baby brother, must deal with the bullying of a neighbor boy and discovers that his dog, whom he hears talking with other dogs, is also facing a bully of his own.

J F PAY *Lula Bell on Geekdom, Freakdom, Fifth Grade, and the Challenges of Bad Hair*, C.C. Payne

- Ten-year-old Lula Bell Bonner of White House, Tennessee, tries to fade into the background to avoid a bully, but after her beloved grandmother's death Lula Bell understands about letting her light shine in the darkness.

J F STA *Dweeb: Burgers, Beasts, and Brainwashed Bullies*, Aaron Starmer

- After being framed for stealing bake sale money, the five smartest boys in the eighth grade are imprisoned in a small room beneath their junior high school in Ho-Ho-Kus, New Jersey, and must use their nerdish powers to expose a conspiracy involving fast food, standardized testing, and a school full of overachieving zombies.

J F YEP *Cockroach Cooties*, Laurence Yep

- Teddy and his little brother Bobby devise strategies using bugs to defeat the school bully.

J SER ADA *Adam Canfield, Watch Your Back!*, Michael Winerip

- A much-welcomed snow day turns into an embarrassing nightmare for middle-grader Adam Canfield when, after being mugged by high school bullies for his snow-shoveling money, he becomes the focus of major media attention just as his co-editors at The Slash are launching a contest to out bullies at their school.

J SER ALL *The New Girl*, Meg Cabot

- Guided by her rules, nine-year-old Allie works to get past being just the new girl at school, eagerly awaits the arrival of her kitten, and faces turmoil when her grandmother visits while the family is still settling into their new home.

J SER AME     *Chrissa*, Mary Casanova

- Chrissa Maxwell moves to a new school, and the girls in her fourth-grade class are unfriendly. Her grandmother encourages her to be nice, but the bullying continues. Chrissa must find the courage to stand strong.

J SER AME     *Amelia's Bully Survival Guide*, Marissa Moss

- After successfully commanding the Discovery shuttle mission at Space Camp, Amelia returns to fifth grade where she deals with the bully who has been making her life miserable.

J SER AME     *Amelia Takes Command*, Marissa Moss

- After successfully commanding the Discovery shuttle mission at Space Camp, Amelia returns to fifth grade where she deals with the bully who has been making her life miserable.

J SER AME     *Secrets at Camp Nokomis: a Rebecca Mystery*, Jacqueline Dembar Greene

- When Rebecca attends summer camp in the country because of the spreading polio epidemic in New York City, she is troubled by a bully in her tent and another fellow camper who is strangely secretive.

J SER CAL     *Calvin Coconut in Trouble Magnet*, Graham Salisbury

- Nine-year-old Calvin catches the attention of the school bully on the day before he starts fourth grade, while at home, the unfriendly, fifteen-year-old daughter of his mother's best friend has taken over his room.

J SER CAP     *Captain Underpants and the Terrifying Return of Tippy Tinkletrousers*, Dav Pilkey

- Dav Pilkey takes readers back in time to the carefree days of kindergarten, when the worst thing George and Harold had to face was NOT evil mad scientists or alien cafeteria ladies but a sixth-grade bully named Kipper Krupp, the nephew of their clueless school principal. And because George and Harold don't actually invent Captain Underpants until fourth grade, the two clever kindergartners are on their own -- using their brains to beat the bully.

J SER DRA     *Dragonbreath*, Ursula Vernon

- Danny Dragonbreath and his friend Wendell get an up-close underwater tour of the Sargasso Sea from Danny's sea-serpent cousin, encountering giant squid and mako sharks--and learn about standing up to bullies in the process.

J SER DRA      *No Such Thing as Ghosts*, Ursula Vernon

- Not only must Danny and Wendell trick-or-treat with skeptical classmate Christiana, school bully Big Eddy dares them to enter a haunted house on Halloween night, where they may have to sacrifice their candy to a ghost.

J SER ELL      *EllRay Jakes is not a Chicken*, Sally Warner

- Eight-year-old EllRay's father has promised a family trip to Disneyland if EllRay can stay out of trouble for a week, but not defending himself against Jared, the class bully, proves to be a real challenge.

J SER ELL      *EllRay Jakes the Dragon Slayer*, Sally Warner

- A mischievous eight-year-old boy helps his sister with a bully problem, while facing a bully of his own at school.

J SER EMI      *Emily Windsnap and the Monster from the Deep*, Liz Kessler

- Reunited with her merman father and now living on an island located in the Bermuda Triangle, twelve-year-old Emily accidentally awakens the fearsome kraken and also faces a bully from her past

J SER FAI      *On the Scene*, Robin Carroll

- Samantha has little sympathy when she hears that "mean girl" Nikki's parents are divorcing, but when Nikki come under attack, Samantha uses her investigative skills and help from her "tech-savvy" best friend Makayla to track down clues in hopes of writing a series on bullying for the school newspaper.

J SER FAI      *Girl Power*, Melody Carlson

- Morgan, Carlie, Amy, and Emily become friends when they join together to avoid a bully, and then undertake a project to clean up the shabby trailer park where they all live.

J SER FAI      *Sophie's Friendship Fiasco*, Nancy N. Rue

- When Sophie's efforts to protect her friends from a group of mean-spirited popular girls lead to misunderstandings at home and at school, she turns to Jesus for help.

J SER FAI      *Sophie Loves Jimmy*, Nancy N. Rue

- Paired with her classmate Jimmy for school and church projects, twelve-year-old Sophie must find a way to dispel the boyfriend rumors and to stop the cyberbullying campaign directed against her and a former school bad boy.

J SER GHO     *Zero to Hero*, Henry Winkler

- When Billy Broccoli moves into his new house, he discovers Hoover Porterhouse, a teenage ghost, is haunting his room, and he helps Billy get in style, stand up to bullies, and conquer his new school

J SER GOO     *Trick or Trap*, R.L. Stine

- On Halloween, Scott and Amanda plan to get revenge on their bullies by luring them into a supposedly haunted house filled with traps, but soon the house has plans of its own.

J SER HAN     *My Dog's a Scaredy-Cat: a Halloween Tail*, Henry Winkler

- Teased by the school bully because of his Halloween costume, underachieving Hank, with the help of his friends, exacts revenge by creating the scariest and grossest haunted house ever and inviting the bully to visit.

J SER HOR     *Horrible Harry and the Hallway Bully*, Suzy Kline

- Selected to join the school safety patrol squad, third-grader Mary quickly turns into a bully and classmate Doug suspects she may be tampering with the book raffle.

J SER JAK     *Ballet Bullies*, Jake Maddox

- Marissa has always loved dancing, but lately, she feels clumsy and awkward when she dances, and she feels bigger and taller than the other girls. She doesn't even bother trying out for the Rose Fairy ballet, but someone else thinks Marissa has what it takes to play the part.

J SER MEA *Sorry I'm Not Sorry*, Nancy N. Rue

- While in mandatory counseling to avoid being expelled from Gold Country Middle School for bullying, Kilie Steppe, twelve, focuses on getting revenge against Tory, who took her place as "queen bee," while revealing details that might explain why she preys on her peers.

J SER MEA *You Can't Sit With Us*, Nancy N. Rue

- Ginger Hollingberry, a new sixth grader at Gold Country Middle School, relies on her faith and friends when she is bullied for being different by the "queen bee" of GCMS, Kylie Steppe, and her so-called Wolf Pack, not only at school but twenty-four hours a day through social networking.

J SER MEL *The Fake Cape Caper*, Greg Trine

- Melvin Brederman, superhero in charge of Los Angeles, attends the Superhero's Convention in Las Vegas, leaving his young sidekick to keep Los Angeles safe from evil bad guys and bullies.

J SER MEL *The Revenge of the McNasty Brothers*, Greg Trine

- As Melvin and Candace continue their crime-fighting work as superheroes, the McNasty Brothers, the McNasty Sisters, and the school bullies all plot to get even with them.

J SER MID *How I Survived Bullies, Broccoli, and Snake Hill*, James Patterson

- When Rafe Khatchadorian is sent to Camp Wannamorra, he teams up with his bunk mates to fend off the more "popular" kids' plans to ruin their summer.

J SER MID *Just my Rotten Luck*, James Patterson

- Rafe Khatchadorian's new year at middle school is starting to look depressingly like the old one, except that art class is going well--and when he joins the flag-football team and demonstrates some talent as a running-back, he discovers a way of dealing with his bullying nemesis and teammate, Miller the Killer.

J SER MIL      *Warp Speed*, Lisa Yee
