STEP Campaign Continues to Promote Safer Streets
Wylie Police Department Reports January Results

Wylie, TX, April 24, 2008 – The City of Wylie Police Department, through a \$39,000 grant from the Texas Department of Transportation’s (TxDOT) STEP (Selective Traffic Enforcement Program) program, kicked off a year long targeted traffic enforcement campaign in mid October 2007. The grant provides funding for additional patrol hours focused on traffic violations including DWI, speeding in high accident areas and occupant safety (seatbelt, child safety seat) offenses.

During the month of January, the third full month of the STEP grant, officers logged more than 134.5 hours of additional patrol time. The increased enforcement resulted in two DWI arrests, 182 speeding violations, 13 safety belt violations and 25 miscellaneous traffic citations. Totals for three months of the grant include 465.5 hours of additional patrol time resulting in 23 DWI arrests, 499 speeding citations, 51 safety belt violations, two safety seat violations, three arrests (other) and 85 miscellaneous traffic citations.

“We are pleased with the results of the STEP Campaign,” says WPD Lieutenant Mike Atkison. “Increased enforcement efforts in January continued to build on the initial success of the program, making Wylie’s roads and streets safer for our residents.”

STEPs are grants provided by TxDOT to local law enforcement agencies enabling them to put more officers on the street to address areas that contribute to high fatality rates in vehicle
