



Smith Public Library Holds Frankenstein Adventure

Wylie, Texas, Sept. 19, 2018 – Wylie’s Smith Public Library invites all brave souls to attend Mary Shelley’s Frankenstein – An Interactive Adventure from 6 to 7:30 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 13.

Sleuths age 18 and up are invited to help Mary Shelley complete her classic novel in this immersive experience. Solve puzzles and follow clues to bring her characters to life. Costumes (early 19th century) are not required but are encouraged.

This event is presented by the Durian Grey Company, a North Texas troupe of “steampunk performers, musicians, and scoundrels,” specializing in interactive theater ranging from murder mystery parties to Victorian martial arts classes.
